Families with incomes above 150 percent of the federal poverty level who participate in the Children''s Hearing Aid Program will be required to pay back a portion of the assistance with interest. Approximately 38 families could pay an average of \$1,100 each, for a total of \$39,300 in FY 2021, expected to increase to a total of \$41,600 in FY 2022.
