UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this bill could cost counties approximately \$5,000 in aggregate in one-time costs related to processing withholding request forms, updating voter records, and responding to inquiries; these costs could be absorbed by the counties. Additionally, enactment of this bill could increase revenue to local governments by about \$1,000 per case for fines/fees. This bill could also cost justice courts an unknown amount in court processing costs and county jails about \$70 per day per offender in incarceration costs.

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To the extent that individuals violate provisions of this bill, this could cost certain offenders about \$1,950 per case; the total amount is unknown.

Regulatory Impact

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

Notes on Notes
