UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could cost a public water user approximately \$1,100 per meter and \$5,000 for development of a conservation plan. The total estimated impact on public water users could be \$23,123,400, based on 492 community systems with estimated 30 unmetered connections per entity, and 471 non-community systems with estimated four unmetered connections per entity.
