Governor's Office has indicated it can absorb the costs in its existing budget.

Enactment of this bill could cost counties statewide an estimated net cost of \$1,015,700 one-time in FY 2020 to modify the presidential primary to conform to the requirements of this bill including costs to provide drive-up voting, reprint ballot envelopes, and mail ballots to all active voters and savings from removing all early voting and voting day polling places from the primary election.
