To the extent that individuals or businesses violate the provisions of this legislation, they could pay a civil penalty of up to \$100,000, or more under certain criteria, as well as attorney costs, which would be deposited in the Attorney General Litigation Fund beginning in FY 2021. If an individual is convicted of a third degree felony as a result of this legislation, the State could realize additional revenue from the criminal penalty to the following accounts beginning in FY 2021: \$3,650 to the General Fund and \$50 to the Court Security Account. If a business is convicted, revenue to the State from the criminal penalty could be as follows: \$14,700 to the General Fund and \$50 to the Court Security Account.

Local Government

To the extent that an individual is convicted of a third degree felony as a result of this legislation, justice courts could collect additional revenue of \$1,300 from fines and fees beginning in FY 2021. If a business is convicted, revenue to justice courts could be \$5,250. If an individual is sentenced to jail time, county jails could experience costs of \$70 per offender per day.

Individuals & Businesses

Individuals or businesses who violate the provisions of this legislation could pay a civil penalty of up to \$100,000, or more under certain criteria, as well as attorney costs. Those who are convicted of a third degree felony as a result of this legislation could pay a criminal penalty of \$5,000 for individuals and \$20,000 for businesses.
