This bill appropriates \$520,000, including \$33,800 from the General Fund for FY 2021, plus \$154,853,000, including \$47,972,700 from the General Fund for FY 2022. These appropriations support the operations and capital acquisitions of state government, including expendable funds and accounts. It transfers another \$12,009,500 in FY 2022 from the General Funds into other funds and accounts.
