Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

To the extent that bail forfeitures decrease as a result of this legislation, enactment of this bill could reduce a maximum revenue of \$750 to the local prosecuting office per offender. To the extent that incarceration times are lengthened as a result of this legislation, counties could see increased costs of \$83 per offender per day to house individuals who are held without bail.
