Enactment of this legislation likely will not materially impact state revenue.

Enactment of this legislation could save the State Board of Education \$162,300 one-time in FY 2021 from a one-year delay in developing and administering the pilot program at the State Board of Education and for grants to participating Local Education Agencies. Appropriations for these costs were rescinded in the 2020 Sixth Special Session, thus absorbing the savings. Implementing the underlying program amended but not created in this bill would cost approximately \$147,300 ongoing and \$15,000 one-time.

Local Government UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could save Local Education Agencies (LEAs) an estimated \$87,300 one time in FY 2021 from delayed implementation of the pilot program. The underlying program amended but not created in this bill could cost LEAS \$87,300 ongoing beginning in FY 2022.
