Enactment of this legislation may cost 12 of 13 local health departments around \$200 to inspect body art facilities. These costs should be covered by around \$200 per facility from new licensing revenue.

Body art facilities may pay around \$200 in licensing fees.

**Regulatory Impact**

Enactment of this legislation could result in a small increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
