For every 10 additional felony cases that require a hearing, this could cost local prosecutors about \$8,800 ongoing beginning in FY 2021 for additional case preparation costs, however the total amount is unknown. Similarly, for every 10 additional misdemeanor cases that require a hearing, this could cost local prosecutors about \$4,400 ongoing beginning in FY 2021.
