Enactment of this legislation could shift up to 4% of the unencumbered balance of the Utah Outdoor Recreation Account towards the Utah Children's Outdoor Recreation Education Grant Program (UCORE) as opposed to the Utah Outdoor Infrastructure Grant Program. For FY 2022, this would amount to approximately \$120,000 being usable by UCORE. The amount of funds made available for use each year would depend on the percentage set by the executive director of the Governor's Office of Economic Development.
