Enactment of this legislation could increase revenues to the Tax Commission by \$7,500 in dedicated credits one-time in FY 2022 for license plate production start-up costs, if start-up costs are covered by private donations and not an appropriation from the Legislature. Enactment could increase restricted revenue to the new Donate Life Fund by \$12,500 ongoing for the special license plate fees for an assumed 500 Donate Life license plates in production.

Enactment of this legislation could cost the Tax Commission \$7,500 from dedicated credits one-time in FY 2022 for license plate production start-up costs, assuming a private donor is willing to cover the start-up costs. Enactment could cost the Department of Administrative Services \$700 one-time from the General Fund in FY 2022 to set up the Donate Life Fund (the agency can absorb the cost). Enactment could cost the Department of Health \$7,800 one-time and \$1,100 ongoing beginning in FY 2022 from the Donate Life Fund to establish rules and to distribute money in the fund to organizations whose primary purpose is the the recovery and transplantation of organs and tissues. The remainder of money in the fund not used for administrative costs would then be distributed -- this could be about \$3,600 in FY 2022 and \$11,400 ongoing beginning in FY 2023.

Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct, measurable costs for local governments.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation would allow an individual to purchase a Donate Life special license plate and spend \$25 annually at the time of registration, in addition to the applicable license plate fees. Assuming a minimum of 500 individuals purchase this license plate, the total statewide cost for them would be \$12,500.

Regulatory Impact
