| Enactment of this legislation could increase revenues to the Tax Commission by $\$ 7,500$ in dedicated credits one-time in FY 2022 for license plate production start-up costs, if start-up costs are covered by private donations and not an appropriation from the Legislature. Enactment could increase restricted revenue to the Allyson Gamble Organ Donation Contribution Fund by \$12,500 ongoing for the special license plate fees for an assumed 500 Donate Life license plates in production. |  |  |  |

| Enactment of this legislation could cost the Tax Commission \$7,500 from dedicated credits one-time in FY 2022 for license plate production start-up costs, assuming a private donor is willing to cover the start-up costs. Enactment could cost the Department of Health \$1,100 ongoing beginning in FY 2022 from the Allyson Gamble Organ Donation Contribution Fund for costs to administer proceeds to the fund from sales of Donate Life plates and to issue or reorder plates and decals. |  |  |  |

## Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)
Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct, measurable costs for local governments.

Enactment of this legislation would allow an individual to purchase a Donate Life special license plate and spend $\$ 25$ annually at the time of registration, in addition to the applicable license plate fees. Assuming a minimum of 500 individuals purchase this license plate, the total statewide cost for them would be $\$ 12,500$.

Regulatory Impact

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

## Notes on Notes
