UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could cost Local Education Agencies (LEAs) \$500 ongoing per LEA beginning in FY 2022 to cover administrative costs associated with implementation of the bill. Enactment of this legislation could further cost each LEA \$45 per hour per additional employee required to participate in the training as outlined in the bill. Actual costs may vary depending on LEA size.
