Enactment of this legislation could result in approximately 50 new workplace violence protective order petitions and approximately eight new Class A misdemeanors each year; the resulting fiscal impact is approximately \$5,500 in ongoing revenue to the General Fund and \$300 in ongoing revenue to the Court Security Account beginning in FY 2022.

Enactment of this legislation could result in increased Courts expenditures of \$9,100 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2022 for case processing costs and \$11,000 one-time costs from the General Fund in FY 2022 for Courts IT system updates.

Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could increase revenue to local governments by about \$1,000/case for fines/fees. This bill could also cost justice courts an unknown amount in court processing costs and county jails about \$70/day/offender in incarceration costs. Enactment of this legislation could also cost city and county prosecutors' offices approximately \$27,500 annually for prosecution costs.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

To the extent that individuals violate provisions of this bill, this could cost certain offenders about \$1,960/case; the aggregate impact is unknown.

Regulatory Impact

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

Notes on Notes
