Enactment of this legislation authorizes the Board of Higher Education to issue revenue bonds of up to \$233.2 million (plus direct issue costs) for construction projects at the University of Utah (\$211.5 million), Utah State University (\$9.2 million), and Weber State University (\$12.5 million). Assuming equal annual payments, interest rates of about 2.4 percent, and bond maturities of 20 years for the UU and WSU bonds and 30 years for the USU bonds, enactment could cost about \$14.5 million annually for 20 years beginning in FY 2022 and about \$450,000 thereafter for 10 years from various financing sources for principal and interest debt payments. However, actual payments would depend on the timing and terms of bond issuances.
