Public Benefit:

Purpose: As Utah continues to grow with our limited water supplies, the state needs to promote water conservation and use our water supplies more efficiently. One way that has been shown to significantly reduce water use and is very cost-effective is the installation of secondary meters. That being said it is a significant financial burden on secondary suppliers. One purpose of SB 199 is to provide grant funds to help support small secondary water suppliers in metering their systems.

Services: The enactment of this legislation will allow the Board of Water Resources to offer matching grants up to \$2 million annually. These grants may not exceed 50% of the small secondary water retail suppliers cost of installing secondary meters.

Expected Outcome: The expected outcome of this program is to support small secondary water suppliers in reducing their water use by installing secondary meters. This will also increase the number of secondary meters being installed in small systems.

Implementations and Resources: The enactment of this legislation will appropriate \$2 million from the General Fund to the Division of Water Resources. This will allow the Board of Water Resources to offer matching grants up to \$2 million annually. These grants may not exceed 50% of the small secondary water retail suppliers cost of installing secondary meters.

How: The proposed activities will increase the number of secondary meters installed and will help to reduce water use in the state.
