Enactment of this legislation may cost the Department of Health \$1,400 ongoing General Fund beginning in FY 2024 for 34 hours of staff time annually to check facilities for surgical smoke evacuation systems and policies. The Department of Health has indicated that it can absorb this cost.

**Local Government**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Local governments that own facilities that conduct surgeries may experience costs between \$2 and \$80 per surgery.

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct expenditures from tax or fee changes for Utah residents and businesses.

**Regulatory Impact**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation could result in a small increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

This bill does not create a new program or significantly expand an existing program.

**Notes on Notes**

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
