Enactment of this legislation could increase the annual transfer to the General Fund by \$300 ongoing beginning FY 2023 as a result of additional certifications.

Enactment of this legislation could cost the Department of Commerce \$100 from the Commerce Service Fund annually, beginning in FY 2023 to review certifications. The agency has indicated that they can absorb the costs.

## Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct, measurable costs for local governments.

## Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could result in an estimated five legacy qualifier applicants per year paying a \$50 fee to have their certification application reviewed, for a total cost of \$300 starting FY 2023.

## Regulatory Impact

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation could result in a small increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

This bill does not create a new program or significantly expand an existing program.

**Notes on Notes**

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
