Enactment of this bill could increase revenue to local governments up to \$1,000/case for fines/fees. This bill could also cost justice courts an unknown amount in court processing costs.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

To the extent that individuals violate provisions of this bill, this could cost certain offenders up to \$1,000/case, however the total amount is unknown.

Regulatory Impact

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation could result in a small increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

Performance Evaluation

JR1-4-601

This bill does not create a new program or significantly expand an existing program.
