Enactment of this legislation could cost the Utah State Board of Education \$1,530,000 ongoing, and -\$30,000 one-time to account for enrollment growth in two future years, from the Education Fund beginning in FY 2023 for costs related to Dual Immersion programs within the Minimum School Program. It could also cost \$320,000, one-time, from the Education Fund to replace funds lost by Local Education Agencies due to the provisions of the bill. This legislation could also cost Southern Utah University \$600,000, one-time from the Education Fund for the establishment of the Helen Foster Snow Cultural Center. The Legislation could also result in incremental expenditure increases in future fiscal years for the University of Utah based on concurrent enrollment program growth.
