UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

In the event of an individual bringing and winning a lawsuit again a Local Education Agency (LEA) for violations of the statute, enactment of this legislation could cost the LEA \$10,000 one-time for damages and additional costs associated with the suit in the event of judgments against the LEA. Costs may vary based on the number of cases pursued.
