Enactment of this bill could reduce year-end transfers to the General Fund from the Commerce Service Fund by \$22,900 one-time in FY 2023 and by \$228,500 ongoing beginning in FY 2023.

Enactment of this bill could cost the Department of Commerce \$22,900 one-time in FY 2023 and by \$228,500 ongoing beginning in FY 2023 to review regulations and land use. Spending from the Commerce Service Fund impacts year-end transfers to the General Fund.
