To the extent that more people are convicted as a result of this bill and pay their financial obligation, this could increase revenue/case in the following amounts: (1) General Fund \$1,070; (2) Court Security \$53. To the extent that education institutions or their third-party contractors violate provisions of this bill, the Board of Higher Education could receive up to \$25,000 in civil penalties from institutions, however the total amount is unknown.

Enactment of this legislation appropriates \$770,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2023 and \$275,000 one-time in FY 2023 from the Education Fund to the Board of Higher Education. Enactment could cost the board approximately these amounts for up to seven full-time permanent positions and two full-time temporary positions to implement a data research program. Enactment moves the Utah Data Research Center (UDRC) from the Department of Workforce Services (DWS) to the board, which could lead to moving FY 2023 ongoing appropriations for UDRC from DWS to the board as follows: \$966,200 from the General Fund; \$6,700 from federal funds; and \$435,800 from revenue transfers. To the extent that education institutions or their third-party contractors violate provisions of this bill, this could cost institutions up to \$25,000 in civil penalties plus payment of damages and costs to parents and students, however the total amount is unknown.

Enactment of this bill could increase revenue to local governments by about \$380/case for fines/fees. This bill could also cost justice courts an unknown amount in court processing costs and county jails about \$83/day/offender in incarceration costs.
