Enactment of this legislation could cost the State Board of Education approximately \$75,700 ongoing from the Education Fund beginning in FY2023 and \$75,000 one-time from the Education Fund in FY2023 for establishment of core standards, commission support, professional training for teachers, and travel and per diem for commission members. Enactment of this legislation could also cost the Legislature approximately \$16,000 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY2023 for legislator compensation for commission participation. The ongoing costs would end after FY2026, assuming the commission is repealed on July 1, 2026.
