To the extent that additional causes are action are brought against a defendant as a result of this bill, enactment of this bill could generate in filing fees for each case \$321 to the General Fund, \$30 to the Court Security Account, \$15 to the Judicial Retirement Account, \$5 to the Dispute Resolution Account, and \$4 for the Children's Legal Defense Account.
