This bill appropriates \$6,504,500, including \$835,900 from the General Fund, for FY 2023, plus \$167,146,300, including \$59,109,600 from the General/Income Tax Funds for FY 2024. These appropriations support the operations and capital acquisitions of state government, including expendable funds and accounts. It transfers another \$12,009,500 in FY 2024 from the General Fund into other funds and accounts.
