Enactment of this legislation could result in an increase in personnel costs within the State Board of Education of \$294,000 one time in FY23. Additionally, costs associated with the creation of a new license relating to the vetting and implementation could cost USBE upwards of \$46,000 one-time in FY23. Extended training resulting from this new license could see ongoing personnel costs within USBE increase by \$86,000 ongoing starting in FY24. All associated costs would be drawn from the Income Tax Fund.
