Local Government UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

This bill requires LEA boards to establish student instruction transparency policies and annually report to them to the state board as well as to adopt new processes for making curriculum publicly available. LEAs may see additional costs relating to posting curriculum depending on their availability of IT software and/or may see additional costs related to increased personnel time from IT staff.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct expenditures from tax or fee changes for Utah residents and businesses.
