Enactment of this legislation may cost the Department of Health and Human Services one-time from the General Fund \$3,000 in FY 2023 and \$86,100 in FY 2024 for staff time to create a report on improving the surveillance and treatment of sickle disease in Utah. The agency has indicated that it can absorb \$400 of the FY 2023 costs and \$15,500 of the FY 2024 costs.
