Local Government

Enactment of this legislation could reduce revenue to Local Education Agency"s (LEAs) by \$33.10 per background check ongoing beginning in FY 2025 for lost user fees. The total impact statewide is unknown, but the State Board of Education anticipates it will be minimal.

Individuals & Businesses

Enactment of this legislation could result in a cost savings of \$33.10 per application of a licensed employee and non-licensed substitute teacher during the application process for their required background check.

Regulatory Impact

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

Performance Evaluation

This bill does not create a new program or significantly expand an existing program.
