Enactment of this legislation could increase revenue to the Court Security Account by \$8,000 ongoing, the Dispute Resolution Account by \$1,200 ongoing, the Children's Legal Defense Fund by \$900 ongoing, the Civil Fees Judges" Retirement Account by \$3,500 ongoing, and the General Fund by \$75,400 ongoing all beginning in FY 2025 from civil commitment filing fees.

Enactment of this legislation could increase Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice's expenditures by \$50,000 one-time from the General Fund in FY 2025 to contract with consultants for a study and recommendations concerning the need for expanded civil commitment capacity in the state. The legislation could increase Health and Human Services' expenditures by \$8,000 one-time from the General Fund in FY 2025 to develop training materials to guide the discharge process from a local mental health authority. The legislation could increase Courts' expenses by \$82,000 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2025 to process an increase in involuntary commitment petitions.

Enactment of this legislation could cost local mental health authorities approximately \$4,073,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2025 for increased civil commitments.
