Local Government UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could cost a local law enforcement agency approximately \$1,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2026 for personnel costs, which can be absorbed, to report firearm statistics to the State Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice. As there are 124 local law enforcement agencies tracked by the Commission, enactment of this legislation could result in approximately \$124,000 in ongoing costs for local law enforcement agencies.

Individuals & Businesses

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct expenditures from tax or fee changes for Utah residents and businesses.

Regulatory Impact

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

Notes on Notes
