Local Government UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could increase the fee revenue collected by fire districts for permits issued to operators of fireworks, special effects, and flame effects performances, while reducing this fee revenue collected by municipalities and counties. To the extent that fire district fees and the volume of permit requests are similar to those of municipalities and counties, enactment of this legislation likely will not result in measurable fee revenue increases for local governments.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

To the extent that fire district permit fees for fireworks, special effects and flame effects performances are similar to municipalities and counties, enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct expenditures from tax or fee changes for Utah residents and businesses.

Regulatory Impact UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

Performance Evaluation JR1-4-601

This bill does not create a new program or significantly expand an existing program.

Notes on Notes
