Enactment of this legislation could increase revenues for the Courts by a total of \$28,800 annually beginning in FY 2025 as a result of increased fines being paid as a result of this statute in addition to receiving a greater portion of currently paid fines due to an increased number of cases being tried in district courts. This revenue increase would be broken down as follows: \$24,100 in the General Fund, \$4,200 in the Courts Surcharge Fund which is then deposited into the General Fund, and \$500 into the Court Security Account.

Enactment of this legislation could cost the Courts \$68,300 ongoing General Fund beginning in FY 2025 for increased judge minutes due to the increased time to resolve a case as a result of enhanced criminal penalties. Of this amount, \$42,800 would go to district courts, and \$25,500 would go to juvenile courts. Enactment of this legislation could also cost the Department of Corrections \$25,400 ongoing General Fund beginning in FY 2025 due to increased probation times required from enhanced criminal penalties.

Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could decrease revenues for justice courts by up to \$18,000 annually due to the enhanced penalties being tried in district courts.

Individuals & Businesses

Enactment of this legislation could lead to individuals convicted of lewdness involving a child to pay up to \$1,500 in court fines per conviction for total annual fine payments of up to \$13,500.

Regulatory Impact

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

Performance Evaluation

This bill does not create a new program or significantly expand an existing program.

Notes on Notes

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
