Enactment of this legislation may cost the Attorney General"s Office \$231,600 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2025 in personnel costs associated with investigating the violation of the quota prohibition and enforcing the statute. Additionally, enactment of this legislation may cost the Department of Public Safety from the General Fund \$150,000 one-time in FY 2024 and \$10,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2025 for the creation of peace officer performance evaluation standards.
