Enactment of this legislation could increase revenues to the General Fund from licensing fees. Based on similar types of fees, licensing revenues would likely be an initial fee of \$2,000 with a renewal fee paid every two years of \$1,000. Total collections are unknown currently as the total number of impacted institutions is unknown.

Enactment of this legislation could cost the Department of Health and Human Services \$500, one-time in FY 2024 from the General Fund to update systems to establish rules and new license category as required in the bill. The Department has indicated it can absorb these costs within existing budgets.

Certain institutions could pay an initial fee of \$2,000 with a renewal fee paid every two years of \$1,000. Total collections are unknown currently as the total number of impacted institutions is unknown.

Regulatory Impact

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation could result in a small increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

This bill does not create a new program or significantly expand an existing program.

Notes on Notes
