## Local Government

Enactment of this bill may change allocations among qualifying school districts from the state Capital Outlay Foundation and Capital Outlay Enrollment Growth programs. Estimates indicate a potential reallocation of approximately \$12.0 million among qualifying school districts using FY 2024 data. The program formula is recalculated each fiscal year, so the actual change for each qualifying school district will vary in FY 2025 based on the number of online students enrolled at implementation.

## Individuals & Businesses

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct expenditures from tax or fee changes for Utah residents and businesses.

# **Regulatory Impact**

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
