#### Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this bill could result in an ongoing fine revenue increase by an estimated \$1,500 beginning in FY 2025. Local government entities could experience the following estimated expenditure impacts beginning in FY 2025: 1. Prosecutors - \$8,100 increase; 2. Public Defense - \$4,500 increase; 3. Local Justice Court - unknown increase.

## Individuals & Businesses

Enactment of this legislation could result in approximately 10 individuals paying approximately \$220 each in fines for a total of \$2,200 annually beginning in FY 2025.

#### **Regulatory Impact**

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
