Enactment of this legislation may cost local education agencies an unknown amount to distribute the selected school climate survey and provide the State Board of Education with the aggregate data resulting from the survey.

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct expenditures from tax or fee changes for Utah residents and businesses.

Regulatory Impact

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

Notes on Notes
