Function

The Department of Health suffered a data breach in April 2012. The data breach affected approximately 780,000 individuals. About 280,000 individuals had their social security number and/or other sensitive information stolen. The funding provides a second year of free credit monitoring services for the approximately 60,000 individuals who have signed up among those who had sensitive information stolen.

Intent Language

The Legislature intends that the Department of Technology Services shall use its contributed capital to pay for the costs of providing the Department of Health's request for "Credit Monitoring" in the amount of \$922,000 one-time without increasing internal service fund rates.
