- (2) When a vacancy occurs for any reason in the office of representative in the Legislature, the [governor] legislative party leader shall fill the vacancy by appointing a person who meets the qualifications for the office from three persons nominated by the central committee of the same political party as the prior officeholder.
- (3) (a) When a vacancy occurs for any reason in the office of senator in the Legislature, it shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next regular general election.
- (b) The [governor] legislative party leader shall fill the vacancy until the next regular general election by appointing a person who meets the qualifications for the office from three persons nominated by the central committee of the same political party as the prior officeholder.
