12	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
13	Section 1. Section 20A-1-503 is amended to read:
14	20A-1-503. Midterm vacancies in the Legislature.
15	(1) As used in this section[,]:
16	(a) "Central committee" means:
17	[(a)] (i) the state central committee, when the legislative district encompasses more than
18	one county; and
19	[(b)] (ii) the county central committee, when the legislative district is entirely within one
20	county.
21	(b) "Legislative party leader" means:
22	(i) the speaker of the House, for a representative who is a member of the majority political
23	party;
24	(ii) the House minority leader, for a representative who is a member of the minority
25	political party;



1	(iii) the Senate president, for a senator who is a member of the majority political party; or
2	(iv) the Senate minority leader, for a senator who is a member of the minority political
3	party.
4	(2) When a vacancy occurs for any reason in the office of representative in the Legislature
5	the [governor] legislative party leader shall fill the vacancy by:
6	(a) appointing the person who meets the qualifications for the office whose name was
7	submitted by the central committee of the same political party of the prior officeholder if the
8	process used to nominate the replacement was the standard process used by that political party to
9	select a candidate without a primary election;
10	(b) appointing a person who meets the qualifications for the office from two persons
11	whose names were submitted by the central committee of the same political party of the prior
12	officeholder if the process used to nominate those persons was the standard process used by that
13	political party to select candidates for the primary election ballot; or
14	(c) appointing a person who meets the qualifications for the office from three persons
15	nominated by the central committee of the same political party as the prior officeholder.
16	(3) (a) When a vacancy occurs for any reason in the office of senator in the Legislature,
17	it shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next regular general election.
18	(b) The [governor] legislative party leader shall fill the vacancy until the next regular
19	general election by:
20	(i) appointing the person who meets the qualifications for the office whose name was
21	submitted by the central committee of the same political party of the prior officeholder if the
22	process used to select that person was the standard process used by that political party to nominate
23	the replacement without a primary election;
24	(ii) appointing a person who meets the qualifications for the office from two persons
25	whose names were submitted by the central committee of the same political party of the prior
26	officeholder if the process used to nominate those persons was the standard process used by that
27	political party to select candidates for the primary election ballot; or
28	(iii) appointing a person who meets the qualifications for the office from three persons
29	nominated by the central committee of the same political party as the prior officeholder.
