		(1) Between the completion of the Legislature's 1998 General
		Session and the beginning of the 1999 General Session, the Joint
		Liaison Committee for Public and Higher Education, the Joint
		Liaison Applied Technology Education Advisory Committee, and
		invited representatives from business and industry shall conduct a
		study on the delivery of applied technology education services in the
		state to secondary and postsecondary students.
		(2) The study shall include at least the following issues:

(a) the need for and feasibility of converting the Sevier Valley Applied Technology Center into a branch campus of Snow College or establishing a similar relationship between the two institutions that would make the technology center an integrated part of Snow College;

(b) whether there is a need to establish additional applied technology centers or community colleges, or both, in various geographical areas of the state to better meet the applied technology education needs of secondary and postsecondary students throughout the state; and (c) an examination of the specific roles and missions of secondary and postsecondary applied technology providers.

(3) The study group shall make a report of its findings, together with any proposals for legislative action, to the Legislature prior to the beginning of the 1999 General Session."
