| 17 | The office shall: |
| 18 | (1) make rules to establish: |
| 19 | (a) basic health and safety standards for licensees, which shall be limited to the following |
| 20 | (i) fire safety; |
| 21 | (ii) food safety; |
| 22 | (iii) sanitation; |
| 23 | (iv) infectious disease control; |
| 24 | (v) safety of the physical plant; |
| 25 | (vi) transportation safety; |
| 26 | (vii) emergency preparedness; |
| 27 | (viii) the administration of medical standards and procedures, consistent with the related |

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| 29 | (ix) [subject to Subsection (11),] consumer [rights] safety and protection; |
