This act enacts uncodified material. *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:* Section 1. Task Force on High School Extracurricular Sports -- Creation --Membership -- Interim rules followed -- Compensation -- Staff. (1) There is created the Task Force on High School Extracurricular § [Sports] ACTIVITIES § 15a consisting of the following **S** [eleven] NINE s members: (a) three members of the Senate appointed by the president of the Senate, no more than two of whom may be from the same political party; (b) **S** [five] THREE s members of the House of Representatives appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives, no more than **§** [three] TWO **s** of whom may be from the same political party; (c) one member appointed by the Utah High School Activities Association; (d) one member appointed jointly by the Utah School Boards Association and the Utah School Superintendent's Association; and (e) a principal from an urban high school appointed by the Utah Association of Secondary School Principals. 26 (2) (a) The president of the Senate shall designate a member of the Senate appointed under Subsection (1)(a) as a cochair of the task force.

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28	(b) The speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate a member of the House
