6	AN ACT RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES; ESTABLISHING CONDITIONAL
7	REQUIREMENTS FOR CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS TESTING AND INSPECTIONS ON
8	PUBLIC BUILDINGS; AND MAKING TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS.
9	This act affects sections of Utah Code Annotated 1953 as follows:

12	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
13	Section 1. Section 63A-5-204 is amended to read:
14	63A-5-204. Specific powers and duties of director.
15	(1) As used in this section, "capitol hill facilities" and "capitol hill grounds" have the same
16	meaning as provided in Section 63C-9-102.
17	(2) The director shall:
18	(a) recommend rules to the executive director for the use and management of facilities and
19	grounds owned or occupied by the state for the use of its departments and agencies;
20	(b) supervise and control the allocation of space, in accordance with legislative directive
21	through annual appropriations acts or other specific legislation, to the various departments,
22	commissions, institutions, and agencies in all buildings or space owned, leased, or rented by or to
23	the state, except capitol hill facilities and capitol hill grounds and except as otherwise provided by
24	law;
25	(c) comply with the procedures and requirements of Title 63A, Chapter 5, Part 3, Division

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- of Facilities Construction and Management Leasing;
 - (d) acquire, as authorized by the Legislature through the appropriations act or other specific legislation, and hold title to, in the name of the division, all real property, buildings, fixtures, or appurtenances owned by the state or any of its agencies;
 - (e) adopt and use a common seal, of a form and design determined by the director, and of which courts shall take judicial notice;
 - (f) file a description and impression of the seal with the Division of Archives;
 - (g) collect and maintain all deeds, abstracts of title, and all other documents evidencing title to or interest in property belonging to the state or any of its departments, except institutions of higher education and the School and Institutional Trust Lands Administration;
 - (h) report all properties acquired by the state, except those acquired by institutions of higher education, to the director of the Division of Finance for inclusion in the state's financial records; and
 - (i) take all other action necessary for carrying out the purposes of this chapter.
 - (3) (a) The director shall direct or delegate maintenance and operations, preventive maintenance, and facilities inspection programs and activities for any department, commission, institution, or agency, except:
 - (i) the State Capitol Preservation Board; and
 - (ii) state institutions of higher education.
 - (b) The director may choose to delegate responsibility for these functions only when the director determines that:
 - (i) the department or agency has requested the responsibility;
 - (ii) the department or agency has the necessary resources and skills to comply with facility maintenance standards approved by the State Building Board; and
 - (iii) the delegation would result in net cost savings to the state as a whole.
 - (c) The State Capitol Preservation Board and state institutions of higher education are exempt from Division of Facilities Construction and Management oversight.
 - (d) Each state institution of higher education shall comply with the facility maintenance standards approved by the State Building Board.
 - (e) Except for the State Capitol Preservation Board, agencies and institutions that are exempt from division oversight shall annually report their compliance with the facility

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maintenance standards to the division in the format required by the division. 57 58 (f) The division shall: 59 (i) prescribe a standard format for reporting compliance with the facility maintenance 60 standards; (ii) report agency and institution compliance or noncompliance with the standards to the 61 62 Legislature; and (iii) conduct periodic audits of exempt agencies and institutions to ensure that they are 63 64 complying with the standards. 65 (4) (a) In making any allocations of space under Subsection (2), the director shall: (i) conduct studies to determine the actual needs of each department, commission, 66 67 institution, or agency; and (ii) comply with the restrictions contained in this Subsection (4). 68 69 (b) The supervision and control of the legislative area is reserved to the Legislature. 70 (c) The supervision and control of the judicial area is reserved to the judiciary for trial 71 courts only. 72 (d) The director may not supervise or control the allocation of space for entities in the 73 public and higher education systems. 74 (e) The supervision and control of capitol hill facilities and capitol hill grounds is reserved 75 to the State Capitol Preservation Board. 76 (5) The director may: 77 (a) hire or otherwise procure assistance and services, professional, skilled, or otherwise, 78 that are necessary to carry out the director's responsibilities, and may expend funds provided for 79 that purpose either through annual operating budget appropriations or from nonlapsing project 80 funds; 81 (b) sue and be sued in the name of the division; and 82 (c) hold, buy, lease, and acquire by exchange or otherwise, as authorized by the Legislature 83 through an appropriations act or other specific legislation, whatever real or personal property that 84 is necessary for the discharge of the director's duties.

(6) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection (2)(d), the following entities may hold

title to any real property, buildings, fixtures, and appurtenances held by them for purposes other

than administration that are under their control and management:

88	(a) the Office of Trust Administrator;
89	(b) the Department of Transportation;
90	(c) the Division of Forestry, Fire and State Lands;
91	(d) the Department of Natural Resources;
92	(e) the Utah National Guard;
93	(f) any area vocational center or other institution administered by the State Board of
94	Education; and
95	(g) any institution of higher education.
96	(7) The director shall ensure that any firm performing testing and inspection work
97	governed by the American Society for Testing Materials Standard E-329 on public buildings under
98	the director's supervision shall:
99	(a) fully comply with the American Society for Testing Materials standard specifications
100	for agencies engaged in the testing and inspection of materials known as ASTM E-329;
101	(b) carry a minimum of \$1,000,000 of errors and omissions insurance; and
102	(c) when testing concrete, use laboratory facilities that are inspected annually by the
103	Cement and Concrete Reference Laboratory, a division of the National Institute of Standards and
104	Technology.
105	[(7)] (8) Notwithstanding any other provision in this part, the Board of Regents may accept
106	buildings, land, or a combination of buildings and land, donated to an eligible higher education
107	institution without obtaining approval of the donation from the director of the Division of Facilities
108	Construction and Management.
109	[(8)] (9) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, if a donor donates land to an
110	eligible institution of higher education and commits to build a building or buildings on that land,
111	and the institution agrees to provide funds for the operations and maintenance costs from sources
112	other than state funds, and agrees that the building or buildings will not be eligible for state capital
113	improvement funding, the higher education institution may:
114	(a) oversee and manage the construction without involvement, oversight, or management
115	from the Division of Facilities Construction and Management; or
116	(b) arrange for management of the project by the Division of Facilities Construction and
117	Management.
118	[(9)] (10) Notwithstanding Subsections (2)(c) and (d), the School and Institutional Trust

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- Lands Administration may hold title to any real property, buildings, fixtures, and appurtenances
- held by it that are under its control.
