31 (b) The President of the Senate and Speaker of the House shall appoint their respective  
32 members to each subcommittee.

33 (c) The ~~[Retirement]~~ Quasi-Governmental Entities Subcommittee shall have the same  
34 members as the ~~[Retirement Standing and Retirement Interim Committees]~~ Legislative  
35 Quasi-Governmental Entities Committee created in Section 63-95-201.

36 (3) (a) A majority of any committee or subcommittee constitutes a quorum for the  
37 transaction of business.

38 (b) In determining a committee or subcommittee quorum, a majority is at least 50% in one  
39 house and more than 50% in the other.

40 (c) In all decisions of the subcommittees, a majority vote will prevail. A majority vote is  
41 at least 50% of the members of one house and more than 50% in the other house in attendance.

42 (4) (a) There shall be an Executive Appropriations Committee consisting of 18 members  
43 composed of:

44 (i) three members of the majority leadership of the Senate and four members of the  
45 majority leadership of the House;

46 (ii) two members of the minority leadership of the Senate and three members of the  
47 minority leadership of the House;

48 (iii) the chair of the Senate Appropriations Committee and the chair of the House  
49 Appropriations Committee; and

50 (iv) (A) one member from the majority party of the Senate as appointed by the President  
51 of the Senate or as chosen by the Senate majority caucus;

52 (B) two members from the minority party of the Senate as appointed by the Senate  
53 minority leader or as chosen by the Senate minority caucus; and

54 (C) one member from the minority party of the House as appointed by the House minority  
55 leader or as chosen by the House minority caucus.

56 (b) A member of the Executive Appropriations Committee, whose membership is  
57 determined under Subsection (i) or (ii), may appoint a designee to permanently serve in that  
58 individual's place with the approval of the Speaker or the President for any majority party member

59 or with the approval of the House or Senate minority party leader for any minority party member.

60 (c) In all decisions of the Executive Appropriations Committee, a majority vote prevails.

61 When a division is requested, that vote must include at least 50% of the members of one house and  
62 more than 50% of the members of the other house in attendance.

63 (5) (a) The Executive Appropriations Committee shall meet no later than the third  
64 Wednesday in December to:

65 (i) direct staff as to what revenue estimate to use in preparing budget recommendations;

66 (ii) decide whether or not to set aside special allocations for the end of the session;

67 (iii) set aside an appropriate amount for fiscal note bills;

68 (iv) approve the appropriate amount for each subcommittee to use in preparing its budget;

69 and

70 (v) set a budget figure.

71 (b) The chairs of each appropriation subcommittee are invited to attend this meeting.

72 (6) The Office of Legislative Fiscal Analyst shall prepare revised revenue estimates in  
73 February.

74 (7) The Executive Appropriations Committee shall include in its consideration tax  
75 collections and revenue policy, tax administration, and analysis of revenue sources.

76 (8) (a) With the approval of the Executive Appropriations Committee, time schedules for  
77 subcommittee meetings will be determined so that no conflict exists with the annual general  
78 sessions or standing committee meetings of the Legislature.

79 (b) Appropriations subcommittees may not meet while the Senate or House is in session  
80 without special leave from the Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate.

81 (9) (a) (i) It is the duty of the appropriations chair of each house to receive the reports of  
82 the subcommittees and to forward the reports to the Executive Appropriations Committee.

83 (ii) The Executive Appropriations Committee shall combine the reports into a total  
84 appropriations bill.

85 (b) The Executive Appropriations Committee shall establish a liaison between their  
86 committee and each of the appropriations subcommittees.

87 (10) All proposed items of expenditure to be included in the final appropriations bill,  
88 including appropriations for the Legislature and its committees and staff, shall be submitted to one  
89 of the subcommittees named in this rule for consideration and recommendation.

90 (11) (a) After receiving and reviewing subcommittee reports, the Executive Appropriations  
91 Committee may refer the report back to an appropriations subcommittee with any guidelines the  
92 Executive Appropriations Committee considers necessary to assist the subcommittee in producing  
93 a balanced budget.

94 (b) The subcommittee shall meet to review the new guidelines and report the adjustments  
95 to the chairs of the Executive Appropriations Committee as soon as possible.

96 (12) (a) After receiving the reports, the appropriations chairs will report them to the  
97 Executive Appropriations Committee.

98 (b) That committee shall:

99 (i) make any further adjustments necessary to balance the budget; and

100 (ii) complete all decisions necessary to draft the final appropriations bill no later than the  
101 38th day of the annual general session.

102 (13) (a) During the interim, the Executive Appropriations Committee shall meet at least  
103 every other month on the day before interim meetings on alternating months between Legislative  
104 Management Committee meetings.

105 (b) The first meeting of the Executive Appropriations Committee shall be in the month  
106 following the first meeting of the Legislative Management Committee.

107 (c) The appropriations subcommittee chairs may attend these meetings and provide input  
108 regarding their budget.

109 Section 2. **Effective date.**

110 This resolution takes effect upon approval by a constitutional majority vote of all members  
111 of the Senate and House of Representatives.
