5	This act modifies provisions of the Utah Criminal Code relating to the sexual exploitation
6	of children. The act defines terms related to child pornography. The act modifies the crime
7	related to sexual exploitation of a minor. The act also makes technical changes.
8	This act affects sections of Utah Code Annotated 1953 as follows:

11	76-5a-3, as last amended by Chapter 128, Laws of Utah 2000
12	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
13	Section 1. Section <b>76-5a-2</b> is amended to read:
14	76-5a-2. Definitions.
15	As used in this chapter:
16	(1) "Child pornography" means any visual depiction, including any live performance,
17	photograph, film, video, picture, or computer or computer-generated image or picture, whether
18	made or produced by electronic, mechanical, or other means, of sexually explicit conduct, where:
19	(a) the production of the visual depiction involves the use of a minor engaging in sexually
20	explicit conduct;
21	(b) the visual depiction is, or appears to be, of a minor engaging in sexually explicit
22	<u>conduct;</u>
23	(c) the visual depiction has been created, adapted, or modified to appear that an
24	identifiable minor is engaging in sexually explicit conduct; or
25	(d) the visual depiction is advertised, promoted, presented, described, or distributed in a
26	manner that conveys the impression that the material is or contains a visual depiction of a minor
27	engaging in sexually explicit conduct.

28	[(1)] (2) "Distribute" means the selling, exhibiting, displaying, wholesaling, retailing,
29	providing, giving, granting admission to, or otherwise transferring or presenting [material or live
30	performances] child pornography with or without consideration.
31	(3) "Identifiable minor":
32	(a) means a person:
33	(i) (A) who was a minor at the time the visual depiction was created, adapted, or modified;
34	<u>or</u>
35	(B) whose image as a minor was used in creating, adapting, or modifying the visual
36	depiction; and
37	(ii) who is recognizable as an actual person by the person's face, likeness, or other
38	distinguishing characteristic, such as a birthmark, or other recognizable feature; and
39	(b) does not require proof of the actual identity of the identifiable minor.
40	[(2)] (4) "Live performance" means any act, play, dance, pantomime, song, or other
41	activity performed by live actors in person.
42	[(3) "Material" means any visual representation including photographs, motion pictures,
43	slides, videotapes, or other pictorial representations produced or recorded by any mechanical,
44	chemical, photographic, or electrical means and includes undeveloped photographs, negatives, or
45	other latent representational objects.]
46	[(4)] (5) "Minor" means a person younger than 18 years of age, or who is explicitly
47	represented or described by any person possessing or distributing the child pornography as being
48	under the 18 years of age.
49	[(5) "Nude or partially nude" means any state of dress or undress in which the human
50	genitals, pubic region, buttocks, or the female breast, at a point below the top of the areola, is less
51	than completely and opaquely covered.]
52	(6) "Produce" means the photographing, filming, taping, directing, producing, creating,
53	designing, or composing of [material or live performances] child pornography or the securing or
54	hiring of persons to engage in the production of [material or live performances] child pornography.
55	(7) "[Sexual] Sexually explicit conduct" means [and includes the following acts, whether
56	actual or simulated, regardless of the gender of the participants or their state of dress] actual or
57	simulated:
58	(a) sexual intercourse [or deviate sexual intercourse], including genital-genital,

59	oral-genital, anal-genital, or oral-anal, whether between persons of the same or opposite sex;
60	(b) masturbation;
61	(c) [ <del>sodomy or</del> ] bestiality;
62	(d) [sadomasochistic activities] sadistic or masochistic abuse;
63	(e) lascivious exhibition of the genitals or pubic area of any person;
64	[(e)] (f) the fondling or touching for purpose of sexual arousal of the genitals, pubic region,
65	buttocks, or female breast; or
66	[(f)] (g) the explicit representation of the defecation or urination functions.
67	(8) "Simulated sexual conduct" means a feigned or pretended act of sexual conduct which
68	duplicates, within the perception of an average person, the appearance of an actual act of sexual
69	conduct.
70	Section 2. Section <b>76-5a-3</b> is amended to read:
71	76-5a-3. Sexual exploitation of a minor Offenses.
72	(1) A person is guilty of sexual exploitation of a minor:
73	(a) when [he] the person knowingly produces, distributes, possesses, or possesses with
74	intent to distribute, [material or a live performance depicting:] child pornography; or
75	[(i) a nude or partially nude minor for the purpose of causing sexual arousal of any person;
76	or]
77	[(ii) any minor's engagement in sexual conduct alone or with another person; or]
78	(b) if [he] the person is a minor's parent or legal guardian and knowingly consents to or
79	permits that minor to be sexually exploited under Subsection (1)(a) [above].
80	(2) Sexual exploitation of a minor is a felony of the second degree.
81	(3) It is a separate offense under this section:
82	(a) for each minor depicted, and if more than one minor is depicted in the [same material
83	or live performance] child pornography in violation of this section, the depiction of each individual
84	minor in the [material or live performance] child pornography is a separate offense; and
85	(b) each time the same minor is depicted in different [material; and] child pornography.
86	[(c) each time the same minor is depicted in a separate live performance.]
