8 **State Office of Rehabilitation to purchase assistive technology devices and services. This act**

14 Section 1. Section **53A-24-110.7** is amended to read:

15 **53A-24-110.7. Appropriation for assistive technology devices and services.**

16 (1) § [~~There~~] **SUBJECT TO FUTURE BUDGET CONSTRAINTS, THERE** § is appropriated
16a **§ , AS AN ONGOING APPROPRIATION, §** from the Uniform School Fund for fiscal year [~~2000-01~~]

18 Board of Education to be distributed to the State Office of Rehabilitation to purchase assistive
19 technology devices and services in accordance with rules made by the State Board of Education.

20 (2) The office shall use the appropriation to provide:

21 (a) assistance to individuals with disabilities in acquiring, customizing, and learning to use
22 and maintain assistive technology to facilitate their independence; and

23 (b) support through Independent Living Centers and other similar programs to facilitate
24 interagency cooperation in providing assistive technology devices and services.

25 Section 2. **Effective date.**

26 This act takes effect on July 1, 2001.
